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Overview

Bedford Community Access Television Inc. (BCAT), doing business as Bedford TV, is the contracted PEG service provider for the Town of Bedford, MA. Bedford TV operates three channels on Comcast and Verizon cable systems and provides programming through social media outlets such as YouTube, Facebook, Twitter & Instagram. As the media landscape continues to evolve, and cable subscriber numbers flatten, Bedford TV has proven its commitment to addressing and planning for these changes in order to continue to provide high level services to the Town and build our audience across all platforms.

During FY 2023 Bedford TV saw growth across key metrics such as programming, membership, training, and social media. We committed ourselves to recording and live streaming as many government meetings, athletic games, and other community related events as possible both remotely and in-person, while residents attended from the comfort of their homes. As the year went on and residents were able to attend more of these events in person and government meetings turned to hybrid options, we continued to adapt and make everything available to all residents of Bedford. The following report details the FY23 growth and decline.

11.3.1 Programming and Membership Report

In FY23 Bedford TV broadcasted 24/7 on Comcast channels 8, 9, and 99 and Verizon Channels 38, 39, and 40. Channels 8/38 broadcasted a combination of public access and educational access programming, channels 9/39 broadcasted our electronic bulletin board, and channels 99/40 broadcasted governmental programming. Bedford TV programming was also made available through YouTube to provide on-demand access to PEG programming.

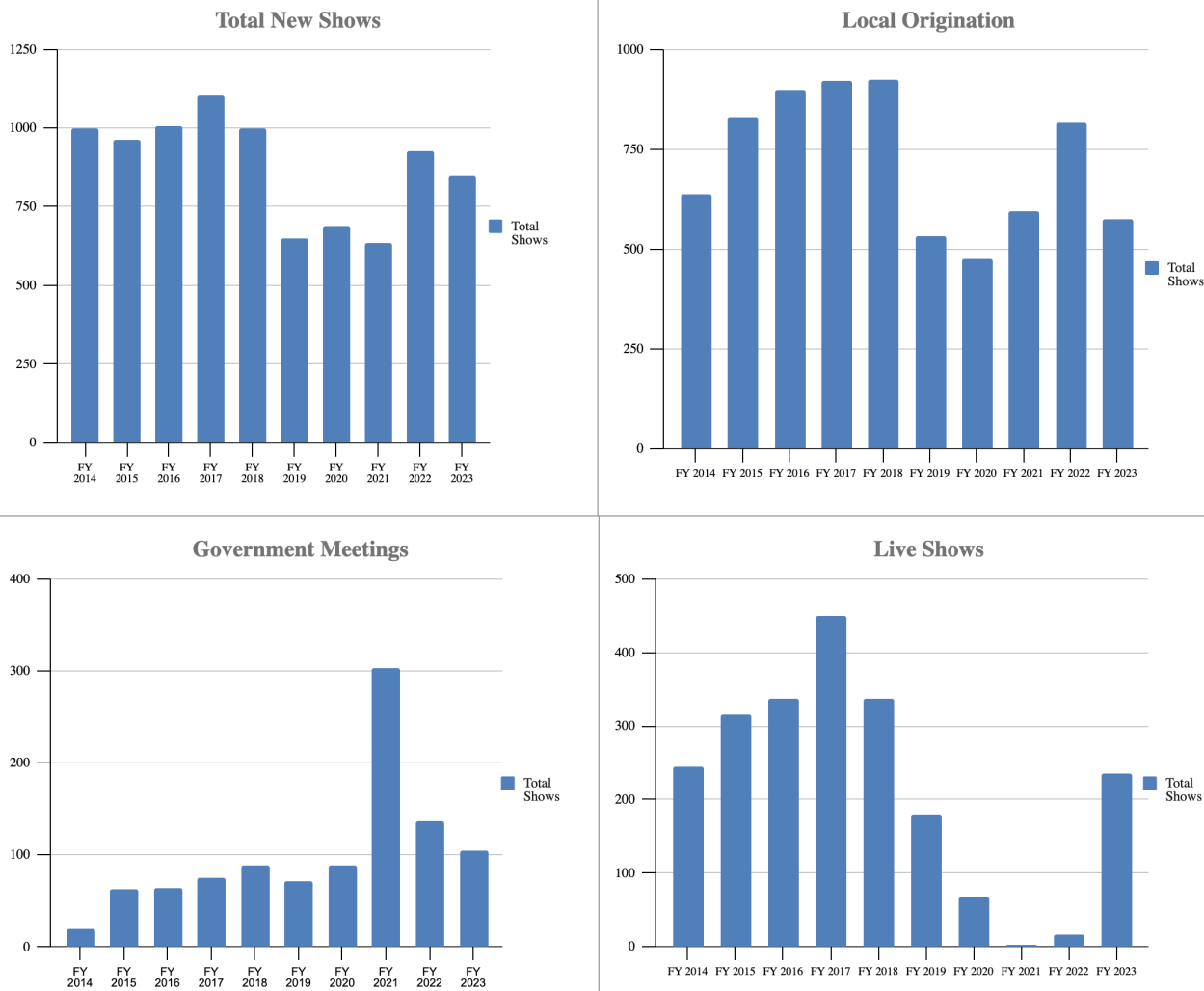
In FY23 Bedford TV produced 847 total new shows for a total of 801.5 hours of content. Of these shows 575 were locally produced, 104 were government meetings and 236 originally aired live. These programs included Bedford TV's coverage of the Bedford High School Graduation, Annual Town Meeting, our weekly News program and many more events around town and in our studio.

This compares with FY22 where Bedford TV produced 926 total new shows for a total of 779 hours of content. Of these shows 817 were locally produced, 136 were government meetings and 17 were originally aired live.

Although the total number of new shows slightly decreased, the total hours of content increased and content originally aired live increased dramatically. Bedford TV continues to cover every Board of Health, Select Board, School Committee, Finance Committee and Planning Board meeting. Bedford TV continues to cover other boards and committees upon request and will share recordings of remote meetings not covered when made available. Our programming growth would not be possible without an active membership base. Membership numbers and engagement are critical to the operations of Bedford TV and in FY 2023 Bedford TV added 18 new members and provided training to 32 previously untrained members.

11.3.1.a Membership Status, Growth, Training, & Activity

Bedford TV membership is free and available to all those who live, work, attend school, or belong to an organization in Bedford. Bedford TV’s members are as diverse as the programming they bring to the station. Our members range in age from school aged to active members of senior groups such as the Council on Aging. We keep a complete list of our members and it is available upon request of the Town.

This year Bedford TV had a few training options for our members. During Q1, we offered an Intro to Adobe Premiere class for adults on July 7th and 8th. This class ran from 6:30pm to 8:00pm for 2 days. There was 1 student in the class. We also finished our last class with students from LABBB. This was a 5 part course that took place throughout the past two years with a large break in the middle due to the pandemic. Upon completion of the course students left with videos they created on how to brush their teeth and wash their hands correctly.

During Q2, Bedford TV held an Intro to Filmmaking class from September 22nd through October 20th. This course was offered in partnership with the Bedford Recreation Department. 8 kids spanning between grades 3 and 8 attended and completed the course. Bedford TV will continue to work with the Recreation Department and offer classes on Wednesdays during the school year for the rest of the year as students get out early from school.

During Q3, Bedford TV held three classes for kids grades 3-8 during Q3. The first was Intro to Filmmaking class that started on January 4th and took place every Wednesday for 4 weeks. There were a total of 11 students in the class. The next class was Intro to Script Writing which took place every Wednesday for 4 weeks starting February 8th. The final class was another Intro to Filmmaking class which started in Q3 and will finish in Q4. There were 17 students in this class. During the Intro to Filmmaking classes, students learned how to use the necessary field and studio equipment to create their own comedy skit video. For each class two groups were made, and each group edited together their own final video. For the Intro to Script writing course students learned about the various types of ways that writing is used in both television and newspapers.

During Q4, Bedford TV finished up the one class that started in Q3 and held two more for kids grades 3-8. The first was Intro to Filmmaking class that started on March 22nd and took place every Wednesday for 4 weeks finishing on April 22nd. There were a total of 17 students in the class. The next class was Intro to Photography which took place every Wednesday for 4 weeks starting April 26th. The final class was another Intro to Filmmaking class which met every Wednesday for 4 weeks starting May 31st. During the Intro to Filmmaking classes, students learned how to use the necessary field and studio equipment to create their own comedy skit video. For each class two groups were made, and each group edited together their own final video. For the Intro to Photography course students learned about various different types of photography from nature shoots to portrait photography. In addition to these courses, Bedford TV gave on-location training to volunteers during productions, as well as one-on-one help with editors at our studio.

The Bedford TV facility was happy to offer both virtual and in-person training opportunities to its members in FY23. Interns and volunteers were trained to use Open Broadcaster Studio (OBS) to record and live stream virtual productions such as the Bedford TV News, Bedford government meetings, Bedford Public Schools' events, and other Town events. Students and adult volunteers were trained on-site to record and live stream Bedford High School Varsity sports and productions throughout the year in our studio.

For high school and middle school aged students, Bedford TV offered community service hours for filming and editing local town and school events that were of value to their community. These included JV and Varsity sports, Annual Town Meeting, Bedford TV News, Veterans Day and Memorial Day and Bedford day parades, Pole Capping and more.

We have continued to improve our equipment and software at Bedford TV to provide the best learning experience for our members. This year editors were given courses on our new Adobe editing software while also being offered refresher courses on older software. We continued to provide one-on-one training to volunteers who were working on productions at home on an as-needed basis through screen sharing and phone calls. Most of this individual training was based in video production editing, was project specific, and catered to the individual needs of the member.

This year seven in person classes were completed by students varying in ages from 10 to 80 years old. In these courses a total of 57 students completed one or more classes. These volunteers were trained in pre-production script writing, post-production video editing, studio and field production,

In addition to training for our members, Bedford TV also offers internships to students. Bedford TV continued to offer its production and communication internships. Our production interns helped with recording and live streaming government meetings with OBS (Open Broadcaster Software), crewing sporting events and editing with Final Cut Pro X, and Adobe Premiere, and creating USBs and DVDs. Lastly, our Communications interns helped create social media posts for our coverage of government meetings and Bedford High School sports. They also worked with our Digital Marketing & Outreach Specialist on other daily tasks. In FY23 Bedford TV had 4 interns.

Additionally, in December, Bedford TV held its seventh Annual BTV Awards Ceremony. The event was held in person in FY23, with members of the Bedford TV and staff broadcasting the event live to YouTube. During the event, we recognized the many volunteers that help at the station. The celebration brought the whole BTV community together, from the people you see on TV, to the people behind the scenes. These

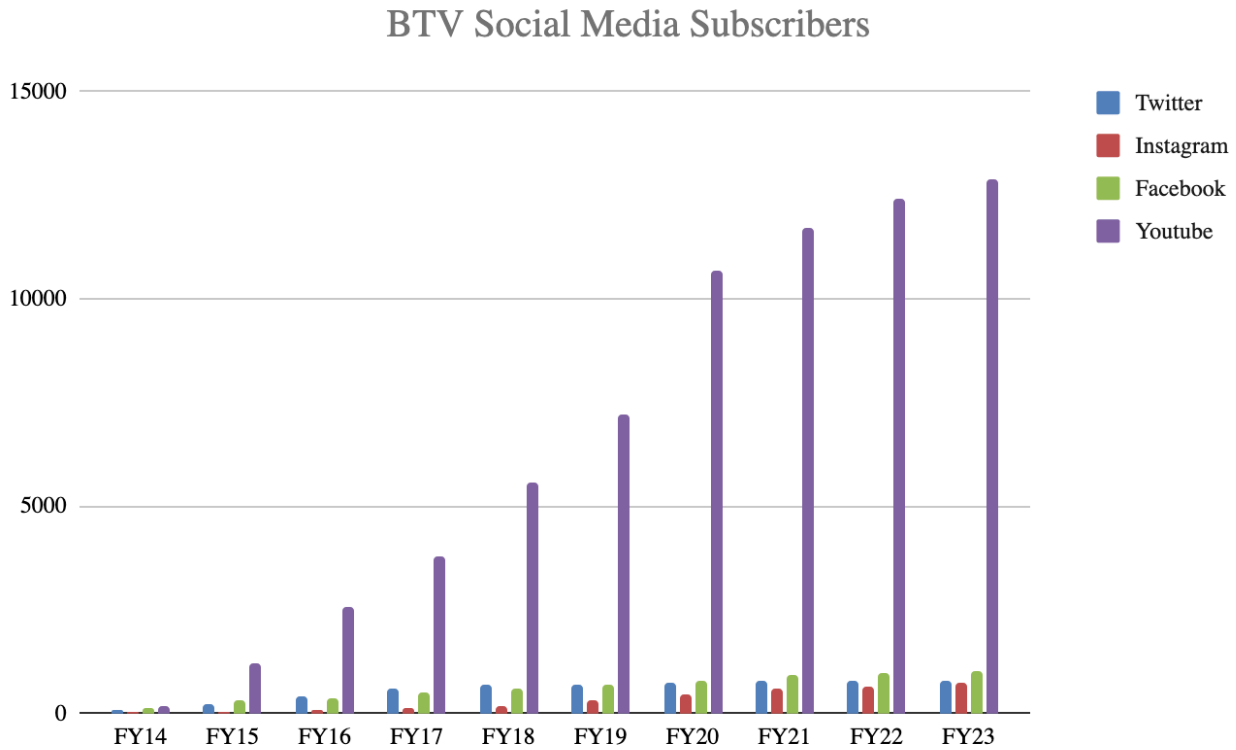
awards were all about celebrating and appreciating the hard work of the many volunteers involved with the station and promoting a sense of community. We continued to recognize our wonderful students this year by adding a new category for best student production. We also recognized all the students who interned with us between December 2021 and December 2022.

To keep members up to date on news and events at the studio, we sent monthly email newsletters to our distribution list. These monthly newsletters included our Volunteer of the Month, class notices, intros to new staff members/interns, and upcoming events. We also included lists of our current sponsors, grantors, and donors as an additional thank you for contributing to our mission. This year we welcomed 18 new newsletter subscribers, with a total of 722 at the end of FY23.

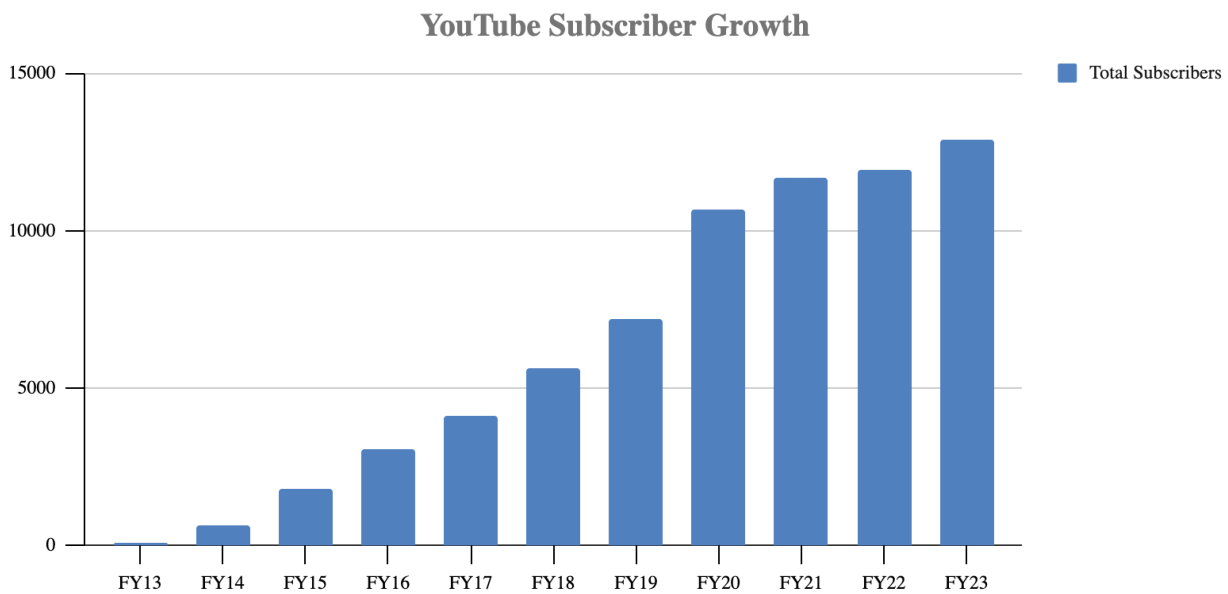
Figure 2: Social Media Subscriber Count

We also kept in touch with our members through social media outlets such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and YouTube. Bedford TV’s online presence continued to grow in FY23. For more detail on our social media statistics see Figure 2 below.

In FY23 our YouTube channel had 216,797,000 estimated hours watched, and 931 new subscribers, bringing the total to 12,859 subscribers.

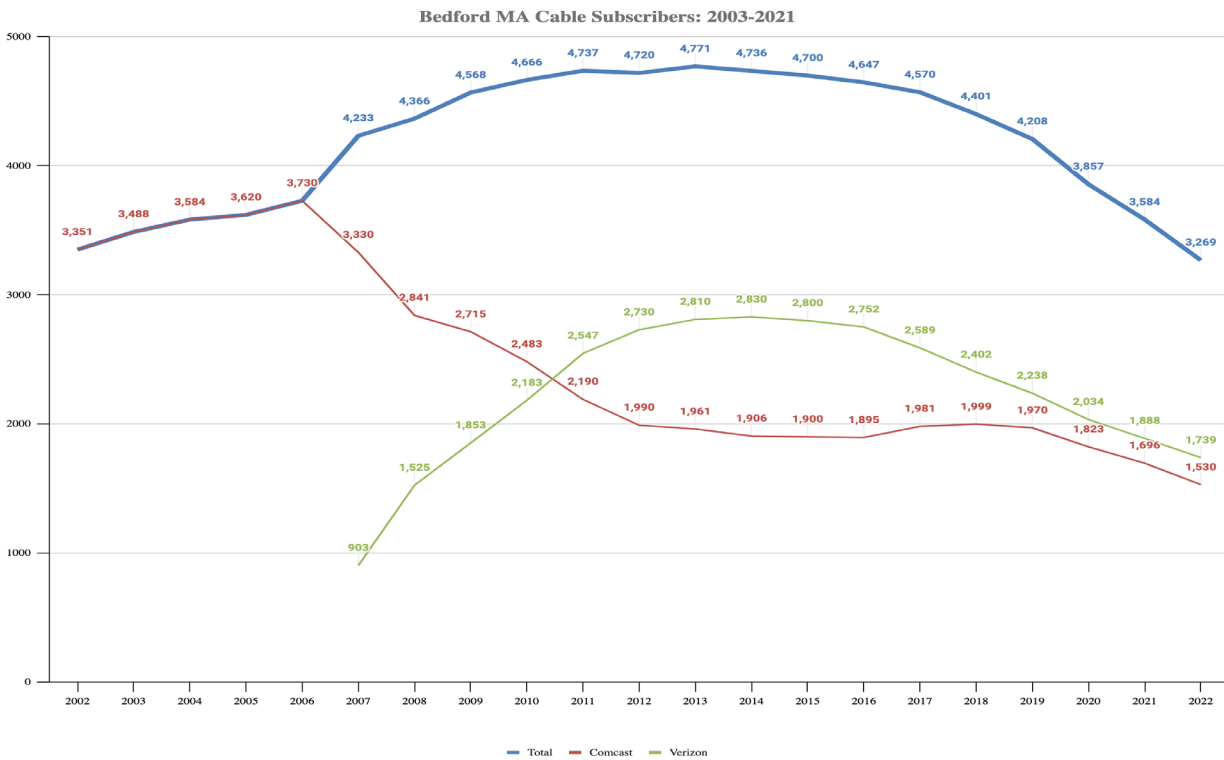

While our YouTube subscribers continue to increase year-over-year, the Town has been seeing a decrease in cable subscribers since 2013. This rate of decline increases each year, as is evidenced by Figure 4 below. By observing this rate of change, a shift from cable to subscriber-based “over-the-top” media streaming services on the internet is evident. In the calendar year 2022 Bedford cable subscribers went down by 315 (8.8%) while YouTube subscribers increased by 614 (4.8%). 11.3.1.b Equipment Use

In FY23 our field cameras were used for a total of 365 hours. Additionally, we had 148 hours of studio time used at Old Town Hall, and 48 hours of editing time. We had 94 hours of equipment usage from the Select Board’s Meeting Room covering government boards and committee meetings.

In FY22 our field cameras were used for a total of 261 hours. Additionally, we had 33 hours of studio time used at Old Town Hall, and 31 hours of editing time. Due to all government meetings being held virtually until late June, we had 5.5 hours of equipment usage from the Select Board’s Meeting Room.

In FY 23 we recorded 96 other government board and committee meetings either via Open Broadcaster Studio (OBS) and Zoom or in the LGI room at BHS for a total of 96 hours.

These numbers show an increase in all areas in FY23, compared with FY22.

11.3.1.d Summary of Activities from PEG programming

PUBLIC

In FY23, Bedford TV's public programming was mostly derived from locally produced content and was supplemented by bicycled programming from other towns. The sources of our locally produced programming ranged from individual producers to Town organizations whose events our members and staff covered. Programs ranged greatly in thematic content; there were music shows, political shows, shows about local business, a weekly live news show, and much more. Our public programming was as diverse as the community it serves and the locally originated shows from the last year reflect that. For a complete list of Public shows from FY23 see Section 11.3.1.c.

Bedford TV strives to make the show submission process as easy as possible for volunteers. In FY23 we accepted programming from members in a variety of new forms. Due to some producers not wanting to come into our studio to produce their shows, some recorded their programs on Zoom, or used personal cameras and submitted digital files to Bedford TV through our Synology NAS or Google Drive. Some producers also uploaded programming to shared servers such as TelVue Connect.

One particular area of focus this coming year for our public access channel is to encourage more producers to create recurring talk shows. We had one recurring new talk show and two new podcasts start this year and will aim to add to that in FY24. With the studio opened back up and our podcast equipment and remote capabilities, creating a show has never been easier.

EDUCATION

Bedford TV's strong relationships with all the public schools in Bedford as well as Middlesex Community College and the LABBB program expanded dramatically in FY 23. We covered all major events at Bedford Schools from the Middle School and High School Tenacity Challenges, to the JGMS Moving On Ceremony and Bedford High Graduation, as well as every School Committee meeting. Bedford TV also live streamed nearly all Bedford High School Varsity sports along with some JV sports, which was greatly appreciated by parents and relatives who could not attend the games in person. We also invited Bedford's middle and high school students, including LABBB students, to be the video crew during the games.

Bedford TV continued to work with Bedford High School students by training them to use field and studio equipment at Bedford TV and offering community service hours for event coverage. Students who used BCAT for community service hours filmed several school and town events such as, JV and Varsity sports, Bedford High School Graduation, and Annual Town Meeting. Community service hours were also offered to students taking classes, volunteering as mentors to help with our youth classes, and recording videos of value to the community. Mentors are students who had previously taken courses at Bedford TV and have tallied over 50 community service hours. There were 38 students in grades 3 through 12 who participated in BRIC2 this year, totaling over 1,180 community service hours. Of these students 4 became mentors this year each totalling over 50 hours of community service each. 93 projects were initiated by students this year. 27 of these projects involved a writing component, a new focus of BRIC2 this year. Although not all the projects were completed, students made substantial progress on each one.

Bedford TV also continued its internship program. This program has been running for the last thirteen years and originally started with just summer interns. This year, we had four interns, who began at various points throughout the school year. This included our typical videography interns, who spent their time primarily recording and live streaming government meetings and sporting events. Some interns also created video

introductions for programs like Bedford TV News and government meetings. All students worked between 10-20 hours a week for five or more weeks.

GOVERNMENT

In FY23, most of Bedford TV's programming was government programming derived from the coverage of Town governmental boards. Bedford TV covered as many committee meetings as possible in FY23 to provide all residents with an opportunity to watch the meetings. Bedford TV has covered every Select Board, Planning Board, and School Committee, Board of Health and Finance Committee meeting as well as other major Town governmental meetings such as Annual Town Meeting and public hearings while also covering other meetings when requested. In FY23, Bedford TV covered 104 government meetings, which represented 281 hours of programming.

In addition to government meetings, Bedford TV worked with other local government organizations and officials to produce and share programming. In FY23 Bedford TV worked with the League of Women Voters and local elected officials. Additionally, we aired programming from the Massachusetts House of Representatives such as their open sessions.

11.3.1.e Complaints and Public Comments

There were no complaints or public comments in FY23 Q1 and Q3. During Q2, and Q4 there were issues with Verizon's signal output on Bedford TV.

In Q2, On November 28th, the Executive Director received a message from a viewer that only a black screen with audio was coming through on Verizon Channel 40. Later, the same viewer relayed information from a Comcast customer that Comcast channel 99 was also only airing a black screen with audio. Both Verizon and Comcast were contacted and tried to fix the issue remotely. After the technicians were unable to fix the problem remotely Verizon and Comcast were contacted again to send technicians to Bedford TV to try and fix the problem. On January 6th technicians were able to come to Bedford TV and discovered that the issue was with faulty equipment inside Bedford TV. The equipment was fixed and the issue has been resolved.

In Q4, On May 12th, viewers of a First Church live stream were not able to hear audio on Verizon channel 40. This was deemed to be an issue with the individual broadcast as the following week's broadcast was perfect.

11.3.2 Fiscal Report

In FY23, Bedford TV saw a total operations income of \$237,905.50 and total operations expenses of \$208,931.91 which netted in a \$28,973.59 underrun. Staff salaries came in \$20,500.60 under budget. This was due primarily to turnover, staff away on leave and no temporary contract labor being hired, and current staff salaries being adjusted to a fair rate during the year. Insurance costs were also \$5,186.06 under budget with only one employee enrolled last year.

The underrun has been returned to the town where it may be used for Bedford TV operations and related items in future years.

11.3.2.d Assets, acquired and/or disposed

In addition to assets added to the equipment list (11.3.2 c), capital assets are acquired from the Town through the Capital Equipment Purchase Request process as outlined in Section 11.5 of the Grant Agreement between The Town of Bedford, Massachusetts and Bedford Community Access Television, Inc.

The following items were suggested by Bedford TV for capital appropriation during FY23.

Light Kit - \$4,636
Field Cameras (1) - \$2,795
Desktop Computers (2) - \$10,136

All of the equipment above was purchased in FY23. All FY22 equipment purchases that were not completed and were carried over into FY23 were also purchased.

Bedford TV did not dispose of any assets in FY23. We are currently reviewing our inventory to compile a list of potentially disposable assets.

11.3.2.e Fundraising activities

Bedford TV raised \$6,787.50 in FY23 in program revenue from elementary school, middle school, and blended-age classes. This is up from the \$4137.50 class revenue in FY22.

Bedford TV also sells physical media at our studio and through our website. This year, we sold \$1,010 worth of DVDs and USBs, down from \$1,675 in FY22. A majority of our media sales come from end-of-school-year events such as graduation. This year, we also had income from media sales from selling copies of BHS sports.

We also raised funds in FY23 for BCAT, Inc., through the Community Partnership program, our new Business Sponsorship and Individual Sponsorship programs, and donations. Specific monetary donations were made in appreciation for our work at Bedford Day, and Bedford High School Sports coverage. Our gross fundraising total for FY23 was \$5,391.48, up from \$4,610.66 in FY22. Our community partners and sponsors were The Goddard School, Black Dog Company, Red Heat Tavern, Diane Bridgeman Dental, and Suzanne and Company. We gave a portion of our funds raised (\$1,000 total) to two graduating BHS students who had volunteered extensively with the station through their academic career in Bedford.

Bedford TV also received a grant from the Bedford Rotary Club in the amount of \$959.52 for the purchase of 4 yearly subscriptions to Adobe Creative Cloud. These accounts were used by Bedford TV staff and volunteers

to learn editing techniques on professional and up to date software.

In total, we spent \$1,492.46 on fundraising activities, BCAT Owned Production Equipment, promotional wear and scholarships. This gave Bedford TV a net income of \$3,899.02 in fundraising for FY23, down from \$4,109.79 in FY22.
